A. INTRODUCTION TO THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP)

1. Introduction

- 1.1. The Export Credit Insurance Corporation of South Africa (SOC) Limited (ECIC or Corporation)¹ is a self-sustained state-owned entity listed under Schedule 3B of the Public Finance Management Act 1 of 1999 (as amended) and established in terms of the Export Credit and Foreign Investments Insurance Act 78 of 1957 (as amended).
- 1.2. The mandate of ECIC is to facilitate and encourage South African export trade, by underwriting export credit loans and investments outside the country, to enable South African contractors to win goods and services contracts in countries outside South Africa. ECIC is a registered Financial Service Provider and is regulated by the Financial Sector Conduct Authority and Prudential Authority (FSP No: 30656). Currently exempted in terms of FAIS Notice 78 of 2019.
- 1.3. ECIC operates from offices at Block C7 Eco Origins Office Park, 349 Witch Hazel Avenue, Highveld Ext 79, Centurion, 0157, South Africa.
- 1.4. Bids are hereby invited for the appointment of a supplier to supply, deliver and install the office furniture on a once-off basis.
- 1.5. This bid is subject to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act No. 5 of 2000 and the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, the General Conditions of Contract (GCC) and, if applicable, any other special conditions of contract. Where, however, the special conditions of contract conflict with the general conditions of contract, the special conditions of contract prevail.

2. Background

- 2.1. The Corporation is currently leasing offices in Highveld, Centurion and in the process of moving offices to its new premises situated at 11 Byls Bridge Boulevard, Building 9, Fourth Floor, Highveld Extension 73, Centurion.
- 2.2. The objective of this bid is to request submissions from qualified bidders to supply, deliver and install the office furniture on a once-off basis.
- 2.3. The total size of the floor is 1 818.89m² useable area.
- 2.4. The space plan will be shared with the successful bidder for installation purposes.

3. Purpose

3.1. The purpose of this Request for Proposal (RFP) is to appoint a supplier to supply, deliver and install office furniture on a once-off basis.

3.2. The details of the required services are contained in the **Attachment 1** for reference.

B. TERMS OF REFERENCE

4. Scope of work

- 4.1. The appointed bidder will be required to:
 - 4.1.1. Source and supply corporate office furniture, in line with technical specifications stipulated in **Attachment 1**.
 - 4.1.2. Deliver and install such corporate office furniture at the following address:

11 Byls Bridge Boulevard Building 9, Fourth Floor Highveld Extension 73 Centurion

- 4.1.3. Replace all items damaged in transit, at no cost to ECIC.
- 4.1.4. Co-ordinate and schedule the project, from inception to completion.
- 4.1.5. Perform quality assurance and control until final inspection and handover.
- 4.1.6. Provide a detailed inventory of all furniture and equipment installed in each office space.

5. General requirements

- 5.1. Furniture offered must comply with the specifications and quantities listed in Annexure A.
- 5.2. Furniture style must be:
 - 5.2.1. high quality material and finishes.
 - 5.2.2. modern, contemporary, aesthetically pleasing.
 - 5.2.3. modular, functional, ergonomically designed.
 - 5.2.4. suitable for an eight (8) hour work day.
 - 5.2.5. uncluttered and easy to use.
 - 5.3. Furniture must comply with approved SABS standards for office furniture, technical specifications number SATS 1286:2011 or latest (on local content). the SABS approved technical specification number SATS 1286:2011 and the Guidance on the Calculation of Local Content together with the Local Content Declaration Templates [Annex C (Local Content Declaration: Summary Schedule), D (Imported Content

Declaration: Supporting Schedule to Annex C) and E (Local Content Declaration: Supporting Schedule to Annex C)] are accessible to all potential bidders on the dti's official website http://www.thedti.gov.za/industrial_development/ip.jsp at no cost. The Templates are also published with this RFP.

- 5.4. All furniture must have a lifespan of eight (8) to twelve (12) years, taking into account fair wear and tear.
- 5.5. Furniture must be durable, easy to clean and maintain and suitable for local weather conditions.
- 5.6. Cabinets to have adequate storage space and work surface area, modern finish and design.
- 5.7. ECIC reserves the right to negotiate and select final furniture.
- 5.8. Floor plans of the new premises will be made available to the successful bidder. Such floor plans remain the property of ECIC, they cannot be shared with anyone and must be returned upon completion of the project.

6. Local content and production

- 6.1. All bids will be evaluated as per National Treasury's Instruction Note on Local Content and Production.
- 6.2. Bids will be evaluated in terms of minimum thresholds for local content stipulated in the bid document.
- 6.3. The declaration made by the bidder in the Declaration Certificate for Local Content and Local Content Declaration: Summary Schedule will be used for this purpose, as indicated in SBD6.2 Form including its Annexure(s). A bid received from a bidder who does not complete SBD6.2 Form will be disqualified from evaluation.

7. Pricing

7.1. Bidders are required to quote on all items listed in **Attachment 1** including all other applicable costs (i.e. delivery, installation, labour, etc).

8. Bid award

- 8.1. ECIC reserves the right not to award the bid to the lowest bidder, but to the bidder representing the best value for money.
- 8.2. Value for money will be determined by reference to the quality, viability reliability, durability of the service and the bidder's technical capacity to execute the bid.

8.3.

9. Bid conditions

- 9.1. ECIC reserves the right to appoint more than one service provider, as well as the right not to appoint any service provider.
- 9.2. ECIC reserves the right to reduce quantities and/or items bought from the identified bidder, due to budgetary constraints or ECIC is not able to agree on delivery terms with the identified bidder.
- 9.3. ECIC expect the furniture to be supplied, delivered and installed within eight (8) weeks from the date of receipt of purchase order.

10. Pre-qualification

Criteria	Description
Project/ Rollout Plan	The project plan must indicate the timelines of each step undertaken in the process e.g. sourcing of materials, manufacturing, delivery and installation. The steps are not limited to mentioned phases.
	The bidder must provider three (3) clients references to whom they have supplied with corporate office furniture. The purpose of references is to obtain feedback on the durability of the corporate office furniture provided.

11. Due diligence/ site inspection

11.1. At the ECIC's discretion, a due diligence and/or site inspection may be conducted on the identified bidder(s) (the due diligence site visit may take place remotely). ECIC will visit the identified bidder(s)' premises with the objective of verifying information as contained in their bid documents.

Terms of Reference

- 11.2. Where applicable, the ECIC will issue criteria for the due diligence review or site inspection beforehand to the applicable bidder(s). Should it be discovered during a due diligence visit or site inspection that the information submitted by the identified bidder(s) is inconsistent with what is on their current premises of business, ECIC reserves the right to disqualify such bidder.
- 11.3. ECIC may identify another bidder(s) using the next highest points obtained in the evaluation phase as stipulated in paragraph 11.1.3, taking into consideration the process followed under paragraphs 10.1 and 10.2.

12. Bid evaluation

12.1. The proposals will be evaluated in phases as highlighted below:

12.1.1. Phase One: Pre-qualification

- 12.1.1.1. Compliance with pre-qualification requirements as listed in paragraph 10.
- 12.1.1.2. Only locally produced or locally manufactured furniture with a stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content will be considered. If the quantity of materials and/or products required cannot be wholly sourced from South African based manufacturers and/or at the designated local content threshold at any particular time, bidders should obtain written approval from the dti (Department of Trade and Industry) to supply the remaining portion at a lower local content threshold. Such requests for approval should be submitted and approval be obtained prior to the closure of this RFP.
- 12.1.1.3. ECIC will only consider a bid if the relevant bidder meets the mandatory requirements listed in paragraphs 12.1.1.1 and12.1.1.2. Where a bidder fails to meet the requirements, the bid will be considered an unacceptable bid and will be disqualified from further evaluation.

12.1.2. Phase Two: Preference point system

The 80/20 preference point system shall be applicable to this phase, where 80 points represent maximum obtainable points for the lowest acceptable price and 20 points represents maximum obtainable points for the B-BBEE level status. Points will be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table as listed in the bid documentation (refer to paragraph 13).

12.1.3. Phase Three: Objective criteria

Terms of Reference

- 12.1.3.1. In this evaluation stage, ECIC will check if the bidder has a person who meet the following criteria in awarding the bid:
 - 12.1.3.1.1. The bidder has a significant shareholder or owner (or equivalent) (directly or indirectly) who is classified or can be classified as a Prominent Influential Person (PIP) in accordance with Financial Intelligence Centre Act, 38 of 2001 (FICA).
 - 12.1.3.1.2. The bidder has a shareholder or member or owner (or equivalent) who has questionable integrity status.
 - 12.1.3.1.3. The bidder has a director or equivalent who is classified or can be classified as a PIP in accordance with FICA.
- 12.1.3.2. Should it be found during this evaluation stage, that the bidder who has attained the highest points under Evaluation Stage Four (Preference Point System) has persons listed in paragraphs 12.1.3.1.1 to 12.1.3.1.3, ECIC reserves the right to conduct further due diligence on the person(s). Should the outcome of a further due diligence not be satisfactory to ECIC or such a person(s) poses an unacceptable high risk reputation and/or integrity of the person(s) be questionable, ECIC reserves the right not to award the bid to that bidder. This process may be repeated to the next bidder if so required.

13. Evaluation Phase Two: Preference point system

13.1. The formula below will be used to calculate the preference procurement points for price:

$$Ps = 80 \left(1 - \frac{Pt - Pmin}{Pmin}\right)$$

Where

Ps = Points scored for comparative price of bid under consideration Pt = Comparative price of bid or offer under consideration Pmin = Comparative price of lowest acceptable bid

Depending on the bidder's level of broad-based black empowerment contribution, a maximum of 20 points may be allocated to a bidder. The points scored by a bidder for broad-based black economic empowerment contribution will be added to the preference procurement points allocated for price.

Terms of Reference

The table below reflects the number of points to be allocated to a bidder based on broad-based black economic empowerment contribution:

13.2. The B-BBEE points will be awarded as per the rating certificate, the points for joint ventures (JV) or consortiums will be awarded based on the certificate of the JV or the consortium.

14. Site Visit

14.1. ECIC reserves the right to conduct a Site visit with the two bidder(s) that ECIC will be procuring from. The evaluation will be based on any question arising from the Bid Evaluation Proceedings based on the submission.

15. Standard bidding documents

15.1. Bidders are required to complete and attach the following Standard Bidding Documents:

15.2. ECIC will not award a bid to a bidder who has not submitted complete and signed Standard Bidding Documents.

16. Instructions to respondents

16.1. Correspondence

- 16.1.1. No telephonic or any other form of communication with any other ECIC member of staff other than the named individual below, relating to this RFP will be permitted. All enquiries must be in writing only.
- 16.1.2. All questions relating to the contents of the tender (conditions, rules, terms of reference etc.) must be forwarded in writing via email to procurement@ecic.co.za by not later than 16 January 2023. Questions received after this date will not be entertained.
- 16.1.3. All questions must reference specific paragraph numbers, where applicable.
- 16.1.4. All enquiries (received on or before the closing date for enquiries) will be consolidated and ECIC will publish one response document on the ECIC website (www.ecic.co.za) within two working days after the date in indicated in paragraph 16.1.2, on or before 18 January 2023.
- 16.1.5. No requests for information shall be made to any other person or place and in particular not to the existing provider of this service.

16.2. Submission of the proposals

16.2.1. Bid documents must be clearly marked for ease of reference and be submitted in PDF format on/or before the closing date and time to the following email address:

- 16.2.2. The following email submission procedures or protocols must be adhered to ensure safe and secure submission of the tender documents and supporting documents:
 - 16.2.2.1. The tender document, including the supporting or returnable documents should be submitted via email on PDF format.
 - 16.2.2.2. If the PDF tender document, including the supporting or returnable documents is less than 20 Megabytes (MB), it should be submitted as one document. If the electronic bid document is more than 20MB, the electronic tender document should be split in order to adhered to the 20MB email capacity.
 - 16.2.2.3. Bidders are also encouraged to submit a USB detailing their tender proposals.
- 16.2.3. Only if bidders are experiencing challenges with emailing documents, tenders can be delivered at the ECIC Offices on/or before the closing date and time at Block C7 Eco Origins Office Park, 349 Witch Hazel Avenue, Highveld Ext 79, Centurion, 0157, South Africa.
- 16.2.4. Any proposal received after the closing date and time will not be accepted.
- 16.2.5. All proposals and all subsequent information received from respondents will not be returned. The proposals should be addressed to the Head of Procurement of ECIC.

17. Timeline of the bid process

17.1. The period of validity of the tender and the withdrawal of offers, after the closing date and time are 180 days, expiring on 13 July 2023. The project timeframes of this bid are set out below:

- 17.2. All dates and times in this bid are in South African Standard Time.
- 17.3. Any time or date in this bid is subject to change at the discretion of ECIC. The establishment of a time or date in this bid does not create an obligation on the part of ECIC to take any action or create any right in any way for any bidder to demand that any action be taken on the date established. The bidder accepts that, if ECIC extends the deadline for bid submission (the Closing Date) for any reason, the requirements of this bid otherwise apply equally to the extended deadline.
- 17.4. ECIC will notify all bidders of the outcome of the bid within 10 days from the date of adjudication of this bid.

18. Bid rules

18.1. Awarding a bid

- 18.1.1. ECIC will not award a bid to a bidder:
 - 18.1.1.1. Who is or the bidder's director(s), trustee(s), shareholder(s), member(s), partners(s) or any person(s) having controlling interest in the bidder are restricted to conduct business with the State.
 - 18.1.1.2. Who is in the employ of the State or has a director(s), trustee(s), shareholder(s), member(s), partners(s) or any person(s) having controlling interest in the bidder who is in the employ of the State as contemplated in the Public Administration Management Act, 11 of 2014 and is prohibited from conducting business with the State in terms of section of PAMA.
 - 18.1.1.3. Who is in the service of the State or has a director(s), trustee(s), shareholder(s), member(s), partners(s) or any person(s) having controlling interest in the bidder and has not declared their business interest as required in the applicable SBD4 form.
 - 18.1.1.4. Has been found to have transgressed Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, 12 of 2004 (as amended).

- 18.1.1.5. Has been found to have transgressed or is transgressing the Competition Act, 89 of 1998 (as amended).
- 18.1.2. ECIC shall not award a bid or contract or order to a bidder whose tax affairs are not compliant, except to foreign bidders with no tax obligations in South Africa.
- 18.1.3. For a bidder or the bidder's director(s), trustee(s), shareholder(s), member(s), partners(s) or any person(s) having controlling interest in the bidder who have declared their business interest as required in the applicable SBD4 form, ECIC will not award a bid to a bidder who has declared their interest and:
 - 18.1.3.1. Is prohibited from conducting business with the State; or
 - 18.1.3.2. Does not have permission to conduct remunerative work outside their employment.
- 18.1.4. ECIC will verify with the relevant Organ of State to determine if paragraphs 18.1.3.1 and 18.1.3.2 are not applicable.
- 18.1.5. ECIC will assume that, the person contemplated in paragraph 17.1.3 is prohibited from conducting business with the State or the person does not have permission to conduct remunerative work outside their employment if it does not receive any response within 10 days from such verification request to an Organ of State.
- 18.1.6. ECIC will then recommend to award the bid to the bidder who achieved the second highest preference points, and should it be established that, the bidder who achieved the second highest preference points have a person contemplated in paragraph 18.1.3, ECIC will conduct verification as contemplated in paragraphs 18.1.4 and 18.1.5. This step can be performed to up to the bidder who achieved the third highest preference points.

18.2. Documents/information required as a condition of award

- 18.2.1. The bidder will submit a signed copy of the declaration form indicating the bidder's ability to deliver the required furniture within the agreed period after receipt of a valid purchase order. In the event that the identified bidder cannot agree to delivery period with ECIC, ECIC reserves the right to award the bid to the next bidder based on the preference points achieved.
- 18.2.2. Proof of registration valid registration on the National Treasury Central Supplier Database (CSD).

Terms of Reference

18.2.3. All SBD's signed and completed, SBD1, SBD4, and SBD6.1.

18.3. Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment and Socio-Economic Obligations

- 18.3.1. As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, bidders are to note that ECIC will allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid BEE Certificate or Sworn Affidavit.
- 18.3.2. Bidders are required to complete SBD 6.1 and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the bidding form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

18.4. **B-BBEE Joint Ventures or Consortiums**

- 18.4.1. Bidders who would wish to respond to this bid as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their bid submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party.
- 18.4.2. If such a JV or consortium agreement is unavailable, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by ECIC through this bid process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to ECIC.
- 18.4.3. Bidders are to note the requirements for B-BBEE compliance of JVs or consortiums as stipulated in the bidding form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status.

Terms of Reference

18.5. **Sub-contracting**

- 18.5.1. If contemplating subcontracting, please note that a bidder will not be awarded points for B-BBEE if it is indicated in its Proposal that such bidder intends subcontracting more than 30% (thirty percent) of the value of the contract to an entity/entity that do not qualify for at least the same points that the bidder qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is a company which is Black Owned, Black Women Owned, Black Youth Owned, owned by Black People with Disabilities, an EME and QSE, with the capability to execute the subcontract.
- 18.5.2. A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 25% (twenty five percent) of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.
- 18.5.3. Respondents are required to indicate the percentage of the contract that will be sub-contracted as well as the B-BBEE status of the sub-contractor/s on the SBD6.1.

18.6. ECIC's rights

18.6.1. ECIC reserves the right to:

- 18.6.1.1. Amend any bid conditions, bid validity period, bid specifications, or extend the bid closing date, all before the bid closing date. Such amendments will be posted on the ECIC's website under the relevant tender information. All prospective bidders must therefore ensure that they visit the website of ECIC (www.ecic.co.za) regularly before they submit their bid response to ensure that they are kept updated on any amendments in this regard.
- 18.6.1.2. Cancel or withdraw this bid at any time, as a whole or in part without reasons and without attracting any liability.
- 18.6.1.3. Award this bid to more than one bidder.
- 18.6.1.4. Negotiate with all or some of the shortlisted bidders.
- 18.6.1.5. Not accept the lowest priced bid or award the bid to a bidder other than the highest scoring bidder.
- 18.6.1.6. Conduct site visits at bidder's offices and / or at client sites if so required.

Terms of Reference

18.6.1.7. Request any relevant information and/ or documents to verify or clarify information supplied in the bid response in relation, but not limited, to the structure of the bidding entity, bidder's capacity, proposed solution, proposed timelines etc.

18.7. Contract fees

18.7.1. Where a bidder indicates that its prices are subject to confirmation, or are in any way conditional, such pricing will not be considered.

18.8. Confidentiality

18.8.1. Any information relating to the submissions, through the process or otherwise shall be treated in strict confidence. In submitting a response, a Service provider agrees that it shall not be entitled to any information disclosed by another respondent to ECIC, which ECIC has determined to be of a confidential nature. The content and details of the evaluation of submissions will remain confidential to ECIC.

18.9. Other matters

- 18.9.1. If the ECIC does not accept any proposal, it will declare this bid process closed and may then elect to:
 - 18.9.1.1. Proceed on a completely different basis; and/or
 - 18.9.1.2. Not to appoint any respondent (in the event it deems all or any of the proposals not appropriate).
- 18.9.2. The ECIC reserves the right to engage in any processes required to validate all claims made in the proposal.
- 18.9.3. The ECIC has the right to enter into negotiation with a prospective Service provider regarding any terms and conditions, including fees, of a proposed contract.
- 18.9.4. Bidders are allowed to submit joint proposals to allow different companies/entities to undertake different components of the work under one single proposal. In such event however, each bidder is required to provide a B-BBEE certificate.

18.10. Disclaimer

18.10.1. The ECIC has produced this bid in good faith. However, the ECIC, its agents and its employees and associates, do not warrant its accuracy or completeness. The ECIC will not be liable for any claim whatsoever and howsoever arising (including, without limitation, any claim in contract,

- negligence or otherwise) for any incorrect or misleading information contained in this bid due to any misinterpretation of this bid.
- 18.10.2. This bid is a request for proposals only and not an offer document; answers to it must not be construed as acceptance of an offer or imply the existence of a contract between the ECIC and the bidder.

18.11. Terms of engagement

18.11.1. The ECIC's engagement of the service provider will be documented in a contract between the ECIC and the appointed bidder.
